# To be held on 12 November 2011 **Dr. James A. McConnell**will give a presentation on the War of 1812

James graduated from Albion College in 1961, earned his M.A. degree in history in 1967 and his doctorate in 1977, both from Wayne State University. His dissertation topic was the participation of Michigan schools in the 1976 Bicentennial of the Declaration of Independence. Now serving as a history education consultant and humanities scholar, James retired in 1999 after many years of service in the Dearborn Public schools. He now serves as a member of the Michigan Historical Commission and, since 2008, a member of the Michigan Commission on the Commemoration of the Bicentennial of the War of 1812. He is the secretary of the 1812 Commission and also is the facilitator of the Great Lakes War of 1812 Bicentennial Collaborative, a consortium of eight states, the province of Ontario and the Government of Canada. He has also served as a member of the Board of Trustees of the Historical Society of Michigan. He has served as an Adjunct Instructor in the School of Education at The University of Michigan-Dearborn and in the History Department of Eastern Michigan University. He has previously taught at Mercy College, Henry Ford Community College and Wayne County Community College. He founded the Michigan Council for History Education in 1993 and served as its Executive Director until 1999. With his wife Annette, he co-edits Ends & Beginnings, a quarterly newsletter of the Michigan Council for History Education. He and his wife, Annette, received a 1998 Volunteer Service Award from the Historical Society of Michigan for their efforts in creating The Days of Detroit 1999 calendar. The calendar was a publication of the Detroit Historical Society. He was on loan to the State of Michigan for five years (1986-1991), where he served as the Executive Director of the Michigan Commission on the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution and the Bill of Rights (1987-(1986-1987) and the Sesquicentennial of Michigan Coordinator for the Michigan Department of Education. Along with more than 100 presentations on the Constitution, he was the Editor of a K-12 Bill of Rights Teaching Resource Guide distributed to all schools in Michigan. He served as coordinator of Bicentennial Projects. In 1994, he received the "Presidential Award" from the Michigan Council for the Social Studies for "outstanding and enduring contributions to the social studies in Michigan.

#### **ALPENA:** Great Lakes Maritime Heritage Center

This is home to the Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary whose mission is to protect "the Great Lakes and their rich maritime history through research, education and resource protection. The sanctuary works to ensure that future generations can enjoy these underwater treasures." The Heritage Center is open all year and does not charge an admission fee. It gives visitors an opportunity to look into the history of our Great Lakes. www.thunderbay.noaa.gov

I still remember the thrill of a field trip to a Planetarium when I was growing up. When I did an online search, there were a LOT of planetariums around the state that came up, most of which stated they have programs for children.

# 39th GENERAL SOCIETY CONGRESS REPORT

The General Society Congress was called to Order on 12 September 2011. Acting Elder, Michigan's own Cory Randall gave the Invocation.

The Michigan delegation consisted of Acting DGG Grace Smith; AG June Gorman; Terry McKane, Delegate; Diane Sonnecken, Delegate; and Bonnie Vokits, Delegate. Also attending were Acting General Society Elder, Cory Randall, Acting General Society Parliamentarian Mary Ellen Byrne.

Items of interest, reported at the Congress were:

Several changes to the Society's Constitution were voted on. These will be reported in the Mayflower Quarterly.

Alicia Williams will act as the Five Generation Chairperson. The Five generation Project has been expanded to include the 6 and 7<sup>th</sup> generation. Michigan's Governor June Gorman will represent Richard Warren and Francis Cooke. The Brewster Books will soon

go to the publisher. Check your Mayflower Quarterly for a current list of published books.

The treasury assets (not including the Mayflower House and its collectables, are 5.3 million dollars.

The Historian reported that over 1000 applications are received per month and the new applicants are low, probably due to the economy. Currently there are 28,842 members.

DNA is currently not accepted as a part of the application process. William White now has a proven DNA lineage. Males can also have a DNA line to a female passenger.

A National Scholarship has been instituted. Check the General Society's web-site for details.

Alice Teal has been with the Mayflower Quarterly for 18 years and reported that the Diamond Jubilee Book is almost finished. The number of pages has been increased.

In the year 2020 the 400 year project will begin. Ideas for events are being explored, such as: anniversary sale items, re-enactments, perhaps sailing Mayflower II, and a thanksgiving parade.

The Flag Captain General provided a manual for each state.

The Mayflower House is getting new rain gutters, new granite steps, among other improvements.

Michigan's Terry McKane, Chairman of the general Society Finance Committee reported that the Society was in good shape and reported a profit. Due to a change in several service categories there a considerable savings to the Society.

A related Pilgrim Trip will be offered every two years. The next trip to England and Holland will be in 2013.

The Insignia Committee reported that there will be a 20% increase due to the increase in gold prices. So if you had planned to purchase any of the Society pins, it would be wise to do so soon.

The States honored with application awards were:

The most percentage in the increase of memberships were Colorado, North Dakota, and Montana.

The most new members were Ohio, South Carolina.

These state names will be engraved on the two silver bowls which are housed at the Pilgrim Museum.

The election of the General Society officers was held at the 39<sup>th</sup> General Congress. The new officers were installed on 13 September 2011. The new Governor General will be Bruce MacGunnigle. He joined the New Jersey Society in 1972. In New Jersey he served as Governor, Deputy Governor, Treasurer, DGG and AG. In 1987 he was elected Captain General by the General Society and then served six years as Member-at-Large. He also served as Assistant Governor General in 1996. He has attended 21 General Congresses and served four times on the Congress Planning Committee. He also served six times on Registration. He was the primary researcher for the Five generation, Volume 4, Edward Fuller and he has written many articles on history and genealogy.

Michigan's new DGG June Gorman and AG Grace Smith were elected by the

General Society. Other General Society officers will be published in the Mayflower Quarterly.

Other events were held:

The dedication of the new brick walkway in the Mayflower House Garden.

The Pilgrim Progress walk and ceremony, with descendants dressed in period dress.


Several family Society Dinners were held throughout the Congress.

A special lecture was given by author/researcher Caleb Johnson on his work regarding the wives of William Mullins and Stephen Hopkins.

Our Historian Diane Sonnecken attended a training meeting for the application process. The Pilgrim Museum hosted a reception, and there was a special tour and slide lecture on Mayflower II both for delegates.

The Michigan delegates voted to purchase a podium banner, now offered by the general Society at the cost of \$100. This banner will have our state, MICHIGAN, personalized on the banner. This has not been ordered yet, as it also requires board approval. They also voted to purchase a History of the General Society, in a buy-one-get-one free offer. This will also need board approval.

Governor General Judith Swan, Quarterly Editor Alice Teal, and Assistant Governor General Harry Folger.

We observe our Pilgrim ancestry with semi-annual meetings; a Spring Luncheon and a Fall Luncheon to honor our ancestral Compact Signers.

We have a very active and dedicated Board of Assistants.

We serve our membership with quarterly newsletters, a beautiful website, and we are constantly adding new experiences to link our members with America's Hometown, Plymouth.

We offer an annual educational scholarship, in the amount of \$1000 and frequently we have given multiple scholarships in the entire amount.
