Bonnie Vekits, our Public Relations Secretary has reported that 36 new members requested that a press release be sent to their local newspaper and of the 36 new member notices sent out, eight members had notices published, but a total of 14 articles were eventually published in 2011, for the eight members.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT

Our Membership Secretary, Anne Burt reports that our Michigan Society has 834 current members, of those 410 are Life members. In 2011, we had 38 new members, 15 deaths, 1 member transferred in from another state, and 7 reinstatements.

CORRESPONDING SECRETARY'S REPORT

Clara Vickers, the Corresponding Secretary, has the task of sending the second dues notices, which puts a burden on our treasury. If you need to pay you dues, please do so promptly and do not ignore your first notice.

Note: We had some later comments on the flag draped on the podium, during the Compact Day Luncheon. It was turned side-ways, but it was intentional. The Mayflower flag has its own standing bracket, but the ceiling was too low to have the flagpole stand upright in its bracket, which was also the case for our U.S.A. flag. Since the Cascade Manor House already had a U.S. flag, we used their flag. It was then suggested that we drape the Mayflower flag on the podium, but because the flag pole (sewed in) would interfere with the flag being draped in an upright position, we had to drape it sideways. The flag pole rested across the back of the podium's top horizontally and kept the flag from falling. We did not think to mention it to the attending members and went on with the meeting. The result was, a few members noticed that the flag was not upright and were concerned. The General Society now has a podium flag, which can be ordered and our board has been discussing its possible purchase. We will be careful, in the future, to mention to the attending membership, when we do something that may seem confusing.
